two above one under is a Loungechair made with a mesh from veneer stripes. These stripes result from waste in carpentries. Woven they become a flexible mesh which is better to deform than plywood. You glue a few of such mesh layers under vacuum to shape a stable seat shell.




Cramp

Cramp is a sun lounger that is covered with used banners.

The Idea: To use an untypical material for outdoor furniture. The design is inspired by the covering used for trucks and has the typical fixing elements like cramps, eyelets and expander cord. The frame is 5mm steel laser cut. Together with the other elements it creates a brand new appearance of a sun lounger.

Used Banners with varied designs, create unique items. Companies could use their own banners for the lounger. But even traditional materials can be imagined for covering. With the easy to disassemble elements: frame, cover material and expander cord there are many color combinations possible.







Is that litter? I don't think so! For others the used parcel strapping tapes are for throwing away, we reuse it as a valuable material. These straps are available in different colours, length and width. They are weatherproof, extremely robust, and are normally used to secure goods on palettes. They become litter after one-time use.

After some material experiments we decided to transform it into a classic weaving pattern, the Vienna Netting. The three seater swing was sanded, repainted and strung with the strapping tapes to show the potential of the material studies.





Spirallight

Spirallight is a ceiling light with spirals of different sizes. The spirals grow together to form a surface. A lasered plug connection keeps the spirals together and makes different positions possible.

This tableware consists of different bowls, plates and cups.







The design is inspired by origami paper structures which principles are folding a square piece of paper without cutting or gluing. The paper bowls are doused with plaster to create a mould for the porcelain. The final product in ceramic keeps the appearance of the folded paper structure.





Origami napkin

The napkins are printed in that way, that a multi-coloured figure is formed when folding e.g. a flower with pink blossom and green leaves. The instruction can be found on the back of the wrapping and is easy to follow because you fold always along the coloured areas.

We did 3D visualisations products for the company Accenta Music. For the audio device "music manager" we designed a user interface and CD cover template.



